



## Long Tom Watershed Council Internship Opportunities Winter & Spring Quarters 2007/08

### HELP RESTORE YOUR LOCAL WATERSHED AND BUILD YOUR SKILLS!

The Long Tom Watershed Council has internship opportunities for Winter Quarter 2007/08. The Council works with potential interns to identify projects that involve the intern's interests and skills in furthering the Council's work.

Following are some potential internship opportunities:

**Fish Passage Barrier Assessment:** This project entails assessing barriers to fish passage in the Long Tom Watershed and identifying priority projects for restoring fish passage. Intern responsibilities would likely include: 1) background research in preparation for seeking landowner permission to survey culverts, dams and other potential barriers to fish passage; 2) conducting barrier surveys in the field; and 3) helping to coordinate the survey team.

**Nonprofit Management:** The Council recently formed as a nonprofit corporation, and is in the process of establishing policies and procedures for managing the organization. This intern position would entail researching and recommending such policies based on recognized best management practices.

**Resource Development and/or Communications/Marketing Plan Creation:** The Council is embarking on a process to create a Resource Development Plan and a Communications/Marketing Plan. Likely intern responsibilities would include background research, producing written components of the plan(s), and creation of specific products (e.g., brochures, display materials, etc).

#### **Hours and Pay:**

We ask interns to work 10-15 hours/week. These are volunteer positions.

#### **Qualifications:**

Specific skills and knowledge required depend on the particular project. The ideal candidate will be able to work independently, have strong research, writing and communication skills, and be committed to the mission and strategies of the Council.

#### **About the Long Tom Watershed Council:**

The Long Tom Watershed Council serves to improve water quality and watershed condition in the Long Tom River basin through education, coordination, consultation, and cooperation among all interests, using the collective wisdom and voluntary action of our community members. We conduct education, monitoring and restoration projects on private and public land from the Willamette River west to the Coast Range Mountains, throughout the Long Tom River Watershed and surrounding area. The Council is a nonprofit corporation with three staff, a 14-member Steering Committee, and a diverse membership, which includes all people living in or interested in the watershed.
