
Long Tom River Maintenance Survey Responses


Question 10. What views do you have of how the Corps conducts Long Tom River maintenance, and ideas for what could be done differently?

- More maintenance and bank clean-up. Not supportive of chemical use.
- Corps not active in my stretch of River (2x).
- Concerned about bank erosion.
- Less Corps bureaucracy before taking action.
- Corps is considerate and does a good job (2x)
- No opinion not sure what actions they have taken.
- Corps needs more money to take more actions.

Question 11a. Overall, would you support river management alternatives that would increase water quality and habitat benefits as long as the main objectives of flood risk reduction and water flow are met?



Question 11b. Are you supportive of the Corps exploring options for maintenance that include approaches that use less chemicals and mechanical approaches, and leaving as much vegetation intact as possible?



Question 12: Not necessarily including projects that involve increased water, would you be interested in partnering with the Corps or Long Tom Watershed Council for maintenance or enhancement projects in the future?
